

Domenick Maldari was born in Giovinazzo, Province of Bari, Italy in 1948. He emigrated to Buenos Aires, Argentina and then lived in New York City from 1961 until 2017 when he moved to Norwalk, Connecticut.

Maldari is mostly self taught. He works predominantly in the medium of painting, however, he has also created works in ceramics, and enjoys carving bone, wood and low relief on slate. While he focuses principally on watercolor, he also enjoys painting in oil, as well as drawing in pencil and pen/ink.

Maldari is foremost a craftsman interested in the uniquely human ability to use one's physical and intellectual capacity for artistic expression using inspiration from nature and our surroundings. He learned how to draw and paint at an early age under the direction and guidance of his father. He graduated from the High School of Art and Design in New York City, and later matriculated to Bronx Community College.

Maldari retired from a lifelong career as a Plumbing and Fire Protection senior designer for Syska and Hennessy Inc. a leading mechanical, electrical and plumbing engineering consulting firms in New York City, his most recent projects where the UN General Assembly, NY Presbyterian Hospital Transplant Unit, Lankenau Hospital New Patient Building and in 1985 the Statue of Liberty Museum Renovation. Now he splits his time between Connecticut and Florida with his wife Nina painting local cityscapes and still life.
